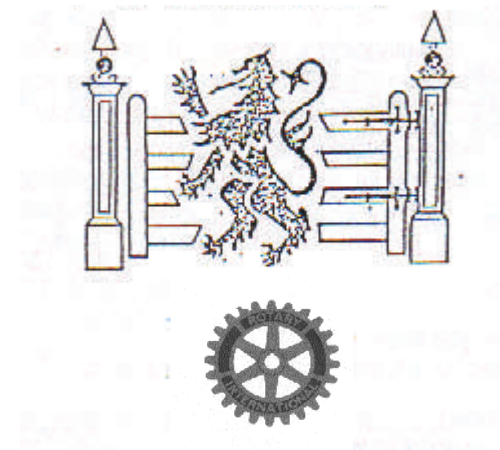

## Events and Fundraising

### October Club Quiz

We were pleased to see several of our regular supporters, including members of the Rotary Clubs of Tooting and Streatham and PP Andy Sayers and his team. The profit plus the raffle raised £234, which has been added to our Charity Trust Fund.

### Christmas Craft Fair

Despite adverse weather conditions, most of the Rotarians and stall holders were able to make it on the day. Thanks to the hard work of the team, led by Barbara and Ken Deller, the event was a great success.

Items on offer included jewellery, cards and stationery gifts, clothing, wooden toys and food. The Practical Action Group had a stall selling tote bags, jams and preserves and books and another stall raised funds for Athol House (Cheshire Home, Dulwich) selling donated toiletries and beauty products.

The café provided refreshments throughout the afternoon and a tombola stall, run by Philippa Deller, offered a number of prizes donated by local businesses and supporters.

We also ran a 'Name the Teddy Bear' competition especially for our younger visitors, which was won by Poppy. The name she chose was 'Tommy'.



There were over 200 visitors and the total sum raised for the End Polio Now campaign was £476.

We should also like to thank the children from **Dulwich Pre-School**, who raised an additional £34.60 for the End Polio Now campaign, after planting the 'Focus on the Crocus' bulbs we gave them (see October).

### Marie Curie Cancer Care

Marie Curie Cancer Care is one charity which the Club has supported on a regular basis. President Glyn and his 'team' were among volunteers collecting at the Tesco superstore in Elmers End on 13th December and they managed to raise £180 on another very cold day.

### Christmas puddings

The club purchased 3 boxes (36 units) of Christmas Puddings from the Rotary Club of Cwmbran Vale. Each pudding sells for £10 with £3 going towards mine clearance projects.

### Christmas Dinner

The club had its traditional Christmas Dinner at Dulwich & Sydenham Hill Golf Club on Friday, 17th December. We enjoyed a seasonal menu and the traditional Christmas message was given by Rev. Maria Coulter. The raffle raised £150.

### Christmas collection

PP Sylvia and President Glyn braved the cold weather in Dulwich Village on Saturday 11th November and collected £51.

PP Sylvia also arranged a collection at Sainsbury's Dog Kennel Hill over the weekend before Christmas. The snowy weather continued to be against us and, unfortunately, most of the volunteers were unable to make it. The total collected was just over £300, which is far short of our usual total but every little helps!

### Donations

Donations have been made from the Club's Charity Trust Fund to People Care Association, Home Start Southwark and the Voluntary Care Centre towards the cost of various seasonal events organised by these charities. £500 has also been sent to the End Polio Now campaign.

A donation was made to Molly's Fund after a visit from one of their speakers, Alex Bell. The fund is raising money for Britain's first Brain Tumour Unit, based at the National Hospital for Neurology and Neurosurgery in London.
